Sub: - Additional Emoluments (Compulsory Deposit) Act 1974 premature repayment on grounds of extreme hardship Delegation of powers –Instructions issued.

In the Circulars cited instructions have been issued regarding premature repayment of Compulsory Deposits in cases of extreme hardship. Complaints have been received by the government that the Heads of Departments are adopting unsympathetic attitude in the matter of premature repayment of the Compulsory Deposits. Government desire that the Heads of Department should not adopt a rigid attitude in this regard and that as far as possible 50% (fifty percent) of the deposits should be released to the employees belonging to Class 111 and IV in cases where valid reasons have been adduced and the employee is in real need of the amount. The applications should also be dealt with sympathetically.
