ORDER

In the G.O.read above, Government have accorded administrative sanction for the implementation of the scheme “Softwood Plantation”. Sanction was also accorded their in for the creation of 6 posts of foresters against 12 posts proposed by the Chief Conservator of Forests. The Chief Conservator of Forests, has, in the letter read as 2nd paper above, stressed the necessity for the appointment of 6 more Foresters under the Scheme, since the planting is being done in 12 Forest Divisions.

2. Government have examined the proposal of the Chief conservator of Forests and are pleased to accord sanction for the creation of 6 additional posts of Foresters on Rs. 40-120 temporarily from the date of appointment till the end of February, 1962 for the Scheme.

3. The post of the Forest Guard on Rs. 35-45 p.m. sanctioned in the G.O read above will be abolished.

4. The expenditure will met from the Provisions available under 10 (b) E (v) Scheme under Five Year Plans- C- Regeneration and opening of softwood Plantations” in the current year’s budget.
