## ORDER

Instances have come to the notice of the Government of officers who have offered themselves for deputation or agreed to be deputed to Government of India Later pleading inability to leave the State or otherwise trying to avoid the deputation or proposing fresh terms and conditions. Such Vacillations on the part of officers cause considerable embarrassment both to the State Government and the proposals are in advanced stages. The Government has, therefore, considered how to avoid such situations in future and order as follow: -

Any attempt on the part of the officers to back out of their willingness given earlier to serve on deputation with the Government of India or any other authority will amount to a breach of undertaking and in the absence of exceptional circumstance, will be sufficient ground for instituting disciplinary proceedings against them under the kerala Civil Services (Classification, Control And Appeal) Rules.
