S.R.O.No. 677/76—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 2 of the Kerala Public Service Act, 1968 (19 of 1968), read with Section 3 thereof, the Government of Kerala hereby make the following amendments, to the Kerala Service Rules, namely:-

AMENDMENT

C.S.No .291/76

In Part III of the said rules in Appendix XIII, in rule 9, in Note 1 for the words, letters and figures "Police personnel who are in receipt of a pay of less than Rs. 200 per mensem" the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"Police Constables, Head Constables and other Police personnel of equal rank in the Police Department"

This amendment shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 1st July, 1973.

Explanatory Note

As per Note 1 below rule 9 under Appendix XIII, Kerala Service Rules Vol, II (first edition of 1974) Police personnel who are in receipt of pay of less than Rs. 200 are eligible for the benefit contemplated in the rules. The terms 'Policeman" has been further clarified to include constables, Head Constables and personnel of equal rank in the Police Department. In the general pay revision which came into force with effect from 1-7-1973, the scale of pay of the post of Police constable has been revised as Rs. 210-340 and that of Head Constable in the Police Department has been revised as Rs. 240-445. Thus according to the monetary limit prescribed in the existing note, the benefit contemplated in the rule cannot be made applicable to many of the constables and Head Constables in the Police Department. This is against the intention of Government. The above amendment is intended to bring out the intention of Government clearly.
