ORDER

In the event of death of an officer, the beneficiaries do not often know and cannot readily ascertain what nomination of any, had been made by the deceased officer and where precisely the nominations made by him had been lodged on the official records.

Government have considered the question and are pleased to issue the following as ruling under rule 86, Part III , K.S.R.

RULING

“An acknowledgement to the officer concerned confirming that the nomination made by him and the related notice have been duly received and placed on record should invariably be sent to every officer making or canceling a nomination, by the Audit Officer in the case of non –gazetted officers. All Officers should be advised that it would be in the interest of their nominees if they would preserve copies of the nomination made by them and of the related notices and acknowledgements, either in their personal custody or in safe deposit along with their other important personal documents etc, where they may be expected to come in to the possession of the beneficiaries on the event of their death.”
