**NOTIFICATION**

S.R.O No 516/75 – In exercise of the power conferred by the proviso to clause (3) of Article 320 of the Constitution of India, the Government Of Kerala hereby makes the following amendments to the Kerala Public Service, Commission (Consultation) Regulations, 1957 as subsequently amended namely:-

**AMENDMENTS**

In the Annexure to the said regulations,

1. after item 12, under the heading “State Services,” the following item shall be added, namely:-
2. “13 Gazetted posts in the office of the Resident Representative, New Delhi.”
3. After item 14 under the heading “Subordinate Service.” The item shall be added, namely:-
4. “15 All posts in the office of the Resident Representative, New Delhi.”

**Explanatory Note**

This note is not part of the notification, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

A present the post Superintendent in the office of the resident Representative, New Delhi is filled up by appointing an Assistant from the Central Secretariat on deputation basis. The other posts except Class IV posts are usually filled up by deputing persons from the Administration Secretariat of this State Government. The posts of class IV officers are filled up by recruitment through the local Employment Exchange. The above posts are treated as belonging to the Kerala Secretariat State and subordinate services. It has been brought to the notice of Government that very often the persons appointed on deputation from the State Secretariat Service, in the office of the Resident Representative request for reversion to the Secretariat and this cause administrative inconvenience. Taking into account the difficulties frequently experienced by Government in filling up the posts in the office of the Resident
