I am directed to issue the following instructions regarding the role of police in evicting encroachers from forest lands for information and necessary action. Normally, the forest staff should evict the encroachers themselves. However, in individual and isolated encroachments where the forest staff find themselves incapable of effecting the eviction, the Ranger or the District Forests Officer concerned may seek Police assistance at the local Police Station, which would be readily complied with by the station House Officer who should then report the fact to his superior police officer.

In large scale and sudden encroachments the District Forest Officer may contact the District Collector who in consultation with the Superintendent of Police concerned may requisition the aid of the required armed Police from the Inspector General of Police which will be complied with immediately in accordance with standing orders of Armed Police Battalions issued in G.O.Ms.45/Home dated 23-1-1963.
