ORDER

The Controller of Accounts has raised a doubt whether for the purpose of rule 26 (a) Part 111 . K.S.R, the period of practice at the Bar should be continuous or whether the actual period of practice even if it is in several spells can be admitted for pension .

2. It is not the intention behind the above rule that the practice at the Bar should be continuous. Government consider that to insist on continuous period of practice at the Bar would be imposing an unnecessary restriction on the grant of the benefit under the rule . They are therefore unpleased to order that the actual the actual period of practice at the Bar even if it several spells will be reckoned for pension under rule 26(a) part 111, K.S.R subject to the other conditions in the rule .

3. The following ruling is also issued.

RULING UNDER RULE 26 (A) .Part 111 K.S.R

(Ruling No 29/70)

For the purpose of this rule the period of actual practice at the Bar need n not be continuous , Actual period of practice even if it is different spells will be reckoned for pension subject to the other conditions in the rule .

This ruling will have retrospective effect from 1-11-1956.
