OFFICERS DEPUTED FOR TRAINING-EXECUTION OF BONDS TO SERVE THE GOVERNMENT.

ORDER

In the G.O. read as first paper above, Government ordered that officers who are ordered by Government to undertake a course of training within India without their applying for it and officers who are selected for training within India and whose period of training is six months and below need not execute any bond after completion of the training, and that in all other cased the officers deputed for training should be required to execute a band with surely binding themselves to serve Government for a prescribed period of years after the training. In the G.O. Second cited, Government has prescribed the period of obligatory service to be rendered by the latter category of officers. But the period of compulsory service to be rendered after training in the case of officers deputed for training outside India for periods of 6 months and below has not been prescribed in the G.O. Second cited. Government order, that officers who are deputed for training outside India for periods of 6 months and below should also executed bonds with sureties undertaking to serve Government after training, for a period of 3 years, if the trainees are paid any allowance, during the period of training and for a period of one year if the trainees are not paid any allowance, but the period of training is allowed to count for increment, leave and pension. The able given in the G, O. second cited will stand modified to this extent.
