ORDER

In the G.O read above it was ordered that the Chalakudy Forest Tramway be stopped with immediate effect. It was also ordered that the workshop attached to the Tramway should be retained. Accordingly necessary proposals regarding the retention of the workshop as well as for the deployment of staff and disposal of Tramway properties were called for from the Chief conservator of forests.

Government after considering the proposals are pleased to order as follows:-

- (i) Persons with two years or less for retirement should be made to retire from service. Wherever possible provisions as contained in rule 63 Part III of K.S.R may be taken recourse to for this purpose.
- (ii) Alternative employment should be provided to retrenched personnel on the basis of suitability as far as possible.
- (iii) Persons for whom it is difficult to find suitable jobs may be discharged with compensation or gratuity according to rules. Similarly, persons who are unwilling to accept alternative employment may also be discharged on payment of compensation pension or gratuity according to rules.
- (iv) Persons selected for discharge or retirement should be given gratuity admissible under the rules in lieu of the notice on discharge.
- (v) The Workshop and the technical staff should be made over to the Public Works Department.
- (vi) Such properties as are required by other Departments would be made over to those Departments. There would be sold up auction after wide publicity.
 The Chief Conservator of Forests will take immediate further action on the basis of the above orders. Points of doubts, if any will be reported to Government and got clarified.
