According to para (3) of rule 88 of Part III Kerala Service Rules Government will be prepared to consider in exceptional circumstances, the award of family pension to families of officers who may die after completing less than 20 years qualifying service the note under the above rule incorporated as per the amendment issued in the G.O. cited, the exceptional circumstances have been defined and its scope specified.

2. The Heads of Departments are now referring such cases to Government for orders without preparing the family pension papers. As Government have already defined the exceptional circumstances under which such cases will be considered by Government a formal sanction of Government is not necessary. The Heads of Departments may therefore, forward the family pension papers in cases covered by the note specified above to Government through the Accountant General for sanction with the details of the case.
