CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM

Sub:- Liberalized Family Pension Scheme 1964-Further Liberalization of-Orders issued in G.O. (P) 95/66/Fin, dated 10-3-1966-Clarified.

According to the order in para 4 of G.O. (P) 95/66/Fin. Dated 10-3-1966, Government servants who were in service on 31-3-1964 and had opted not to be governed by the Liberalized Family Pension Scheme 1964 as ordered in G.O. (P) 269/64/Fin. Dated 13-5-1964 was allowed to exercise a fresh option Scheme as further liberalized in the G.O. dated 10-3-1966. These such an officer died in or after 1-1-1966 but before 31-5-1966 without extended to his family after obtaining the consent of the beneficiary or deduction of an amount equal to two months pay subject to a maximum of Rs.2000 from the Death-cum-Retirement-gratuity admissible. Doubts have been raised whether these concessions will be applicable to those governed by service rules other than Kerala Service Rules. Government are pleased to clarify that the benefit of the orders in para 4 of the G.O. dated 10-3-1966 will be admissible to all Government servants who were in service on 31-3-1964 and were not governed by the Liberalized Family Pension Scheme irrespective of the service rule applicable to them.
