ORDER

Government of India in their Office Memorandum cited, have ordered that the break between War/Military Service and Civil Service will be automatically condoned irrespective of the duration of the break but the period of break itself will under no circumstances be reckoned as qualifying service for pension.

- 2. Government have considered the question of extending the benefit to the State Government employees and are pleased to order that the break between War/Military Service and Civil Service in respect of the State Government employees appointed to the State Service after Military Service will be automatically condoned for pension purposes irrespective of the duration of break but the period of break itself will under no circumstances be reckoned as qualifying service for pension.
 - 3. The above order will take effect from 1-3-1976.
- 4. Necessary amendment to the relevant rules in Part III Kerala Service Rules will be issued separately.
