ORDER

In the existing ceiling limits on T.A were introduced in May 1963. The rates of T.A. D.A and incidental expenses admissible to Government Servants have been substantially increased since then. The scales of pay of the employees have also been revised on four occasions since 1963. The general increase in the price level, which is generally measured by the cost of living index, would effect the expenses an employees has to incur while on tour. The rates of PCA and PTA have also been revised upwards after 1963. Considering all these facts, Government are pleased to refix the ceiling limits for T.A of officers as follows:-

2.The above limits will apply to both touring officers and non-touring officers and tours for all official purposes.

3. The monthly and quarterly ceiling on T.A of the Chairman and members of the Kerala Public Service Commission are also revised as Rs. 1,000 p.m and Rs. 3,000 per quarters.

4.The above limits will also be applicable to all the members of Committees constituted by Government, the rate and ceiling relating to Grade I Officers being applicable to Class I Commission and the rates and ceiling relating to Grade II Officers with actual pay above Rs. 900 being applicable in Class II Committees. It will be open to the departments concerned to seek relaxation on merits, in terms of the special requirements of any Committee.

5.The monthly limit may be exceeded by 20% but the increases should be adjusted within the limit for a quarter. (The quarterly ceiling shall not be exceeded. The limits prescribed will apply only to journeys performed within an officer's jurisdiction. Journeys, outside an officer's jurisdiction, undertaken under orders of competent authority, will not be reckoned for the purpose of the ceilings.

7.The revised ceiling will be applicable from the quarter beginning from 1-7-1980.
