Sub:-Festival advances to N.G.Os- Drawal and disbursement of advance-Instructions Issued.

In the G O cited as first paper, Government have sanctioned advance payment of pay and allowances to NG Os. in connection with religious festivals such as Onam, Deepali,, Easter, etc to be disbursed on the last two working days prior to the festivals. In the G O cited as second paper orders have been issued for the payment of one months' pay /salary or Rs.75 whichever is less for the Onam festival.. This advance is to be drawn and disbursed on the last three working days prior to the Onam Holidays.

- 2. Government have recently received representations from certain Unions complaining that generally bills for festival advances are cashed only on the eve of such festive occasions and this causes very much difficulty to the employees who have to go to distant places to celebrate the festival. It was, there- fore requested that the rules may be amended so as to draw the advance on each occasion early.
- 3. This question has been examined by Government and they are of the view that the difficulty raised could be obviated if the drawing officers present the bills sufficiently early. Government accordingly direct that bills for festival advances should be presented well in time in advance so that disbursement of the advance is not held over to the last working day prior to the festival.
