Sub:- Public Services- Inter- district transfer of District –wise recruits- Imposition of Further restriction- proposal.

I am directed to invite your attention to G.O.Ms. No. 154/71/PD/dated,27.5.1971 introducing the scheme of District-wise recruitment to certain categories of posts, One of the conditions prescribed in that scheme is that the candidates so recruited district-wise should be allowed transfer form one District to another within superior of five years form the State of commencement of continuous service. As the District wise recruitment scheme came into force form 1973. The persons appointed under that scheme may became eligible for transfer to another district by 1970. If persons seeking transfer to a particular District are too many in number it may happen that the vacancies left of direct recruitment may be too few or nil and the chances of appointing direct recruits from the select list of Kerala Public Service Commission may be blocked or substantially curtailed so far as that particular district is concerned. This will affect the principle of District-wise recruitment and will also cause undue hardships to the candidates who apply for appointment to a particulars District, anticipating that there will be vacancies. I am therefore to request you to keep an eye on requests for inter district transfer of District-wise recruits in 1976 and report to Governments in due course the number of vacancies (category wise) arising in each district and the number of eligible application received respect of each District so as to enable Government to review the scheme.
