## ORDER

In the G.O read as first paper above sanction was accorded for the supply of 1000 cum. Of first class Karimaruthu (Mathi) and 20 cum. Of Aini timber to Lekshadweep Administration at Government of India rate fixed for the period from 01-1-1976 to 31-10-1977. The Lekshadweep Administration has taken delivery of 60.492 cum. Of Mathi and 6.680 cum. Of Aini timber from the quantity sanctioned.

- 2. The Executive Engineer, Lekshadweep Administration has requested Government to issue revised sanction for the supply of 1000 cum. of Mathi and 20 cum, of Aini timber at the revised Government of India's rate.
- 3. Revised sanction is accorded for the supply of balance quantity of 939.508 cum. of Mathi (Karimaruthu) and 13.320 cum. of Aini at the Government of India rates fixed for the period from 01/11/1978 to 31/10/1970 as per G.O.Rt.No.432/79/AD dated 13/02/1979.
- 4. The supply will be on the following conditions.
  - 1. The dispatching cost of Rs. 85/- will be deducted from the rates, if the Administration has their own arrangements for the dispatch of timber.
  - 2. In addition to the value and also tax over head charges at 7% and sale tax there on will be paid if the selection is made by the Department and 5% overhead charges and sale tax thereon will be paid if the selection is made conjointly with the departmental Officers.
  - 3. The timber will be supplied subject to availability.
