

Copy of Circular No. 11/65 dated 17/23-7-65 from the Chief Conservator of Forests

I find that it is the practice to use the term "jungle wood" to include valuable timber species like Thembavu, Maruthy, Venteak etc. outside the forest Department, the term "Jungle wood commonly is taken to indicate valueless tree species. This is obviously not the case that the various kinds of woods denoted by the term "Junglewood" at present. To correct the erroneous impression, it will be more advantageous to use the term "Hardwoods" instead of the term "Junglewood" to denote the miscellaneous timber species. In future this may please be adopted.
