I am to invite your kind attention to the "Coimbatore Charter" //compendium of resolutions made in the recently held National Conference of Ministers of Environment and Forests on 29-30, January, 2001 at Coimbatore. You are requested to kindly initiate action on the following items on priority basis.

- a) Declare forest as a priority sector free from all administrative and financial cuts like police department.
- b) Ensure qualitative improvement in forestry personnel through careful recruitment, proper training and proper cadre management.
- c) Provide funds for development of infrastructure like forest roads, staff quarters, communication network, sophisticated arms and adequate number of vehicles. Senior officers should ensure that the infrastructure provided by the state government, is functional and is effectively used for forest protection.
- d) Funds should also be provided for proper demarcation of the boundaries, prevention of encroachments and effective protection to enable forest to regenerate and grow.
- e) To ensure that the management of forest is done according to working plan approved by the central government and adequate funds are available for carrying out silvicultural operations according to the prescriptions to the approved working plans.

Dear Shri Kumar,

I am to invite your kind attention to the "Coimbatore Charter" compendium of the resolutions made in the recently held National Conference of Ministers of Environment and Forests on 29-30, January, 2001 at Coimbatore.

Most of the State Governments have adopted Joint Forest Management programmes and such endeavours have led to effective protection and qualitative improvement in the areas under JFM. This Ministry has also requested state governments to constitute Forest Development Agencies(FDA). Each FDA should be registered under the Societies' Registration Act 1860, so that funds can be made available by Government of India directly to these agencies. JFM committees/Village Forest Committees/ Van Samrakshan Samiti may be registered under the Societies' Registration Act 1860 or any local act or guideline with Conservator of forests. FDA would allot funds to village/forest committees.

The Central Government is willing to provide financial assistance for the purpose under the existing Central Government sponsored schemes.
