## **ORDER**

Rule 90-A(a) lays down that a non-gazetted officer drawing a basic pay not exceeding Rs. 450 p.m. who is granted leave without allowance for the treatment of T.B., Leprosy, Cancer or Mental disease may be granted an ex-gratia allowance equal to 35 per cent of the basic pay he was drawing immediately before the commencement of the leave subject to a minimum of Rs. 100 and a maximum of Rs. 130 per mensem.

- 2. It has now been brought to the notice of Government that the above monetary limits are inadequate and hence have to be enhanced. Government have examined the question in detail and are pleased to order that all Government offices drawing a basic pay not exceeding Rs. 900 p. m., whether gazetted or non-gazetted, will be granted an ex-gratia allowance equal to 35 per cent of the basic pay they were drawing immediately before the commencement of the leave, subject to a minimum of Rs. 200 and a maximum of Rs. 300 per mensem.
  - 3. These orders will take effect from the date of issue.
  - 4. Necessary amendments to the Kerala Service rules will be issued separately.
