## CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM

Dated, Trivandrum, 6th November, 1975.

Sub:— Observance of Silence on 30th January in memory of those who gave their lives in the struggle for India's freedom—Standing instructions.

Every year, silence is observed and work and movement stopped for two minutes throughout the country at 11.00 a.m. on 30th January in memory of those who gave their lives in the struggle for India's freedom. Instructions are issued annually indicating the procedure to be adopted. It has now been decided to issue standing instructions in the matter doing away with the need for issuing instructions annually on this subject. The following procedure should be adopted in this connection:

- (i) Silence should be observed in all cities and Towns in the State at 11.00 a.m. on 30th January and should last for two minutes.
- (ii) A signal should be sounded at 11.00 a.m. on the hearing of which all persons should stand up and observe the silence. It would be more effective and impressive if persons could gather, at one place for the two minutes silence, instead of each person standing alone, in his room or other place where he may be for observing the silence. If the number of employees is large in any office there may be more than one gathering. No effort need however be made to collect together, if it will involve serious dislocation of work. For these two minutes all workshops and factories should stop work where practicable and traffic on the road should come to a standstill.
- (iii) In Trivandrum and other towns the Inspector General of Police will arrange for giving signals by firing guns or by firing heavy petards as indicated below:
  - (a) First firing of gun at 11.00 hrs.
  - (b) Second firing of gun at 11.02 hrs.
- (iv) The commencement and termination of the two minutes' silence should be indicated to the citizens by sounding sirens where sirens exist. To indicate the commencement of the two minutes' silence sirens should be sounded from 10.59 hours till 11.00 hbs. and after the two minutes silence is over "all clear" sirens should again be sounded from 11.02 hours till 11.03 hrs. This procedure may be adopted in City Corporations, Municipalities, Factories and other institutions where sirens exist.



The Director of Public Relations will arrange to give wide publicity in the matter for the information of the general public.
